A few years ago I started one of the language apps (Duolingo) to learn Spanish. It was engaging because it had a bunch of different features which included time to read and learn vocabulary; time to hear words read to you; and time to practice speaking into the microphone. In addition, every time I would complete a 10 minute lesson, it would make a fun, celebratory sound and congratulate me. All in all it was an immersive experience.

But as life happens for a variety of reason, I missed a lesson here, and skipped another one there. And over time I got discouraged and haven't been on for a couple years.


New Year's resolutions are a good time to reset and get back to the practices that shape who we are.

In 2024, the congregation was introduced to the Narrative Lectionary which is

a way to go through the scriptures particularly on Sundays, but also throughout the week.

The primary reason we read the Bible is to get to know the God who loves us. We do that by entering into the story of God's love and spending time together.

We continue into 2025 with the New Testament in the new year and follow Jesus' life from his birth at Christmas to his death and res-



urrection during holy week. Afterward, we'll focus on stories from of the early church and what it meant to follow the resurrected Christ.


If you're making new year's resolutions, I encourage you to immerse yourself in the Bible and learn God's language each day. Spend some time and you'll naturally grow in your faith in the Lord and your understanding of your purpose.

Here are 8 reasons to get involved in reading the Bible this year:

Deepen Your Relationship with God
 Reading Scripture allows you to hear God's voice and understand God's heart.
 It's the primary way God reveals Himself to us.

2. Find Guidance for Daily Living The Bible offers wisdom for making decisions and navigating life's challenges. As Psalm 119:105 says, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." Not sure how to make sense out of the complex world we live in, learn from the ancients who have been asking deep questions of living God's way for millennia.

3. Discover Hope and Encouragement
In times of uncertainty or struggle, Scripture reminds us of God's faithfulness and the hope we have in Christ. It's easy to feel alone or isolated in this world, but daily scripture draws you back into God's presence and the communion of saints.

4. Grow Spiritually

Just as our bodies need food, our souls need nourishment. Reading the Bible feeds your spirit and strengthens your faith. Too many times we are spiritually starved because we haven't been fed by the Word.

Just like you take a break to eat, taking time to read and listen is a natural rhythm of our spiritual lives.

5. See God's Vision

The Bible helps us see the bigger picture of God's work. Too often we are bombarded by our cultural worldview and simply accept it's disappointing and exhausting vision. God has a much more beautiful vision of a world made whole through love.

6. Equip Yourself to Serve and Share

Engaging with God's Word prepares you to encourage others, share the gospel, and live out your faith in action. You may feel like you can't speak the language of faith, but the more you practice it, the more fluent you become.

7. Connect with a Community

Studying Scripture with others fosters meaningful relationships and helps us grow together in Christ. Wrestling with our faith is not merely a solo endeavor, rather we do this together. We have Bible studies on Sunday mornings and resources throughout the week to stay engaged with others. Community helps keep us accountable so that we don't give up when the going gets tough.

8. Embrace a Lifelong Journey

The Bible is a treasure you'll never fully exhaust. Each time you read it, there is something new to discover. There is no finish line because God is ultimately about relationship. It's not a course to be completed, rather a relationship to be cultivated.

As we step into this new year, consider joining a Bible study group, starting a personal reading plan, or exploring Scripture in a way that excites and challenges you. Together, let's make this a year of growth, faith, and grace in action.

January Mission Spotlight

First Footing is our January Mission Spotlight. We will have the opportunity to contribute to this worthwhile organization that identifies and provides assistance to people in our community experiencing housing insecurity or are unhoused. There will be a dedicated collection on Sunday, January 26 and a temple talk from our own Kellie Stallings.

NB Housing Partners was formed in 2013 to address the need for safe, sustainable housing to fill gaps in housing in our community. Our community's rapid growth, particularly over the last decade, has led to a large housing



deficit of approximately 9,500 units for lower income levels. As a result, housing insecurity and homelessness has also grown in our community. To address this crucial need, the agency provides the following services:

- * Health and housing focused street outreach (in collaboration with other agencies and called the health outreach multi-disciplinary engagement or HOME Team) to reach unhoused individuals and connect them to community resources
- * Shelter and support services for up to 42 adults at a time who are experiencing homelessness and would like assistance establishing income and attaining housing (called the First Footing program). Services include basic needs, targeted case management focused on housing goals, job assistance, income benefit enrollment help, transportation, and linkages to behavioral healthcare and medical care, including assistance with medical costs. We plan to add another 20-26 beds by the end of 2025.
- * Housing assistance including housing start-up costs for those choosing to end their homelessness and linkages to help with housing costs for individuals or families that are at risk of losing their housing. We also oversee a community process that tracks individuals who are still in need of housing and prioritizes housing for individuals and families with the highest needs.
- *Starting in early 2025, we will offer short-term housing for up to 6 adults whose income is below current market housing costs, giving them time to increase their income or gain admission into subsidized housing in the community.
- *Longer-term housing. We designed a housing community to support families who are struggling with housing costs, which the New Braunfels Food Bank is now constructing and operating. We will be building additional housing for adults in the next 3-5 years.

In 2023, 572 individuals sought assistance in this community due to experiencing homelessness, a 20% increase from 2022 and more than the number sheltered in 2021 and 2022 combined.

We are committed to taking strategic steps to address both urgent housing crises as well as ensuring that long-term affordable housing options are available at every income
