#### Reports to the Congregation

#### Pastor's Message

Grace and peace to you Peace Lutheran Church of New Braunfels,

In 2020, the world shifted with the pandemic – technically it didn't shift as much as it exposed the paradigm shifts in our world. Our congregation spent energy on relearning what ministry is in a time in which we couldn't gather. We learned about digital ministry and forming partnerships and networks together.

In 2021, the congregation experienced the fallout from the Texas winter freeze as our building flooded and we focused a lot of energy on rebuilding.

In 2022-23, we entered an intentional of finding some stability time and discernment seeking to connect with God's mission and vision in this new era.

Finally, this past year we had the opportunity to implement our clarified mission: To love like Jesus so that each person experiences God's Way.

We focused on four major areas/perspectives to live out this mission:

Stewardship Perspective

Strategy: Increasing our capacity for ministry

The effects of the pandemic still linger. It still feels like we are trying to do more with less. But our hope is that with clear focus, we will maximize the way of God's love in powerful ways. Our strategy to increase capacity is to unleash people's inherent, Godgiven gifts both through generosity and through the spiritual gifts we share.

The Spiritual Gifts Team is a new ministry group who have created an assessment tool to build awareness of each person's gifts and to utilize them for God's purposes. In addition, our Finance Team has worked to cultivate generous hearts.

Loving Our Neighbors Perspective

Strategy: Walking along side of people like Jesus



One of our core values is Compassion. It's the first characteristic God shares with Moses when they meet for the first time. Compassion is seeing and moving toward our shared humanity.

Our Compassion Team really came together this past year and brought the love of Jesus to those struggling in difficult circumstances.

In addition, our Prayer Team meets every Monday to lift up the prayers of the congregation and call upon the Lord sharing our joys, sorrows, and longings.

Some of the most exciting work is our growing relationship with the Salvation Army and a group of faithful folks that cook meals regularly. A special thank you to Kathi Anderson who has spearheaded this partnership and put in countless hours of service. More plans are being developed for 2025 concerning feeding ministries in our hungry world.

Ministry/Processes Perspective

Strategy: Be a Good News church

Being a Good News church means articulating our faith in the story of God. This past year we began utilizing the Narrative Lectionary in worship instead of the RCL (Revised Common Lectionary). As the culture becomes increasingly secular, the story of faith is less and less known. Therefore, the Narrative Lectionary is a tool to help the church go through the Bible more systematically to understand the narrative arc of God's Word and connect both Old and New Testament readings. This means we are not reading 4 RCL scripture passages; rather we focus on one larger portion of the biblical story. In the Fall we stay in the OT and in the spring we center on the life of Jesus and then the early church with the goal of developing our biblical fluency, so that we can be immersed in the Good News (Gospel).

We are also in the process of auditing our digital ministry recognizing that we need to be speaking the language of people where they are at – and people are online. Therefore, we have adopted a both/and strategy of ensuring the Good News is shared in person and online. Look for more implementation in 2025. One of the highlights was the creation of our Spiritual Gifts Assessment that is fully accessible online. A special thanks to Brandy Huston for her efforts in this project.

Discipleship Perspective



Strategy: Equipping people to follow God's Way

Jesus charged his disciples with making disciples – that is, people who follow him. Therefore, the church is focused not only on sharing Good News and inviting people to know God, but to follow God.

We are in the 2nd year of a 2.5 year ELCA initiative called the Life of Faith in which we are looking at ministry beyond what happens as we gather together as the church, but also reclaim the vocational identity of God's partners in ministry in every aspect of our lives. Our Life of Faith team continues to meet with an outside coach as we work through steps to empower the congregation to recognize their vocational calling.

We began a Faith Talk group on Sunday mornings in the Fellowship Hall to talk about anything and everything faith-related because anything and everything IS faith-related. We also dive deeper into the narrative lectionary scripture as we develop our understanding of God's Word and how we can live that out in our lives.

In 2025 we have interest in building some small group ministries to connect people.

#### Leadership

A special thank you to all our congregational leaders: our council, ministry teams, and staff. They have all been critical personnel launching our mission, vision, and values and putting them into practice.

· Council – Our council are the overseers of the church, making sure they provide insight (perspectives in our shared church life), foresight (vision for where we are going), and oversight (accountability to the mission). Megan Wenzel (President), Dan Hill (Vice-

President), Tom Braaten (Treasurer), Brandy Huston (Secretary), Carola Davis, Kathi Anderson, Carol Franz, Vicki Hillmer.

· Ministry Teams – These folks are the engines of ministry at Peace who sacrifice their time and energy to passionately serve and create the pathways to ensure we are living out the mission God has entrusted to us. There are too many folks to list here, but I encourage you to read through their ministry reports to celebrate the various ways we are living out God's mission.



· Staff – We have an entirely new staff this past year which means every day was learning and adapting to the lifecycle of the church.

We were overjoyed to have Deacon Andrew More serve with us these past five years. God has called him to North Caolina to begin a new adventure and move closer to family. Currently we have created a Faith Formation Transition Team that is managing our faith formation programming for all ages and in 2025 will consider staffing for the future.

#### **Council President's Report**

BLESSINGS AND LOVE TO YOU ALL! For those that do not know me, I am Megan Wenzel, married to the wonderful Michael and have two beautiful daughters, Haley and Lillian. I would first like to take this opportunity to thank them for the support that they have provided me during my absence as I have tackled the role of church council president for the 2024 year. This was my 4th year on council as I started in 2020 and 2021 as treasurer, and in 2023 I served as Vice President. I have been truly honored to have been trusted in this leadership position and have loved every minute of it.

Being treasurer, I learned about the heavy financial strain of being in a pandemic, dealing with a freeze shortly thereafter, and the changes in church attendance globally. Although many were struggling, I saw our congregation come together in grace-filled ways - with our gifts of love - volunteering to help in several ways. Despite the chaos, we stepped up monetarily to help with improving our space to provide more opportunities to help our growing community. We were able to make our space liveable so that we could provide shelter for those in need. Our congregation came together on different platforms, stretching our perceived limits and getting us out of our comfort zones to minister to each other- online and in-person, and all while social distancing. We were still very present in the mission to serve our community. Watching the growth of our Peace Pantry and the feedback from those that it serves, along with people in our community dropping off items to share with those in need, showed the true reason why we are here, our mission - to love like Jesus so that each person experiences God's way.

Other highlights of my time with council have been the reinstatement of our endowment fund and the blessings it has bestowed on those that were given grants. The grants that were approved this year alone were for The King's Embrace Group Home in Africa - allowing for a teacher to teach their school for the entire year with benefits, New Braunfels Housing Partner - First Footing to help with permanent housing, The Fundacion Camino de Amas which provided elementary education for impoverished youth, and the Labyrinth Grant to help improve our local space with a community prayer labyrinth. He leaves big shoes to fill, but we welcome the opportunities for lay person assisted worship and leadership, and will do our best, with God's guidance, to continue to grow the experiences he began with us.

We celebrated the retirement of organist, Jeannie, and are truly thankful to her for sharing her gifts with us all these years! What a blessing she has been to us. We were fortunate to hire Steve Robbins as musical director, and his musicianship and leadership have also been a blessing to us! Whether we're singing along with an organ or a guitar or a piano, God has always truly blessed us with wonderful musical ministry and we are grateful!

We also celebrated the retirement of our longtime finance administrator, Valerie, and are thankful for the many years of service. We welcomed Theresa into that finance roll and she has been doing an amazing job!

Unfortunately, we also experienced the insult and painful reality of living in a community that doesn't always strive to love God and their neighbors. We were victimized by vandals this past year, having a very expensive glass door and window shattered by someone hurling rocks into them. The congregation pulled itself together and dug a little deeper into it's pockets and paid for replacement parts. Security cameras have been purchased and installed by the congregation to help keep an eye on things in the future. It's a sad day when a church realizes it must venture into the world not just to help those in need, but to protect itself from those who seek to do it harm. As anyone who has suffered such a violation could attest, we had an opportunity to shut down some of our outreach. We had been given a reason to pull back our ministries to the community out of fear or frustration. However, I'm proud to say that we have neither shut down any of our outreach, nor have we slowed down any of our ministries. With God's grace and love, we weathered that storm and are stronger for it.

I look forward to watching where our spiritual gifts assessment will lead those in being a larger part of what makes Peace a community of believers to serve. I hope that we continue to make new partnerships with organizations aligned with our values to help the larger community.

#### **Property Report for 2024**

Our annual irrigation backflow and fire inspections were completed earlier this year, with all systems passing inspection. As part of the required rotation schedule, several fire extinguishers were replaced. We are currently transitioning to a new inspection company, one that is certified to work on our existing fire alarm panel. Earlier this year, we also upgraded our monitoring system by replacing the existing landline-based monitoring with a Wi-Fi-enabled system, eliminating the need for the AT&T system and reducing associated costs. This transition did require modifications to our fire alarm panel, but we expect to recoup these costs within a short timeframe.

Building settlement continues to cause damage to our sheetrock. To address this, we obtained three proposals for leveling the east wing to prevent further settling and stabilize the structure. A contractor has been selected, and the work is scheduled for mid-February. Once stabilization is complete, we will engage a company to repair the sheetrock and repaint as needed.

We have renewed our contract with Liberty Lawn and Landscaping of New Braunfels for lawn maintenance services. They have been maintaining the property well, effectively managing weeds and ensuring that the shrubs in our planting beds are kept trimmed.

In addition, adjustments were made to our attic stairs to address an issue with the cable track vibrating, causing the cables to come off their pulleys. Temporary repairs were implemented to mitigate the movement as we continue to explore a permanent solution.

The proposed microwave tower project has been put on indefinite hold, as Verizon has withdrawn from the agreement in favor of another location. However, we may still benefit from another provider's interest in the site in the future.

We have installed video cameras throughout the campus, covering all access doors, the playground, sanctuary, and office. We are also exploring options to install additional cameras to monitor the storage buildings. Additionally, we updated the window tinting on the Narthex doors, office doors, and windows to enhance security for our staff. These updates were prompted in part by an act of vandalism this summer, when rocks were thrown through the entrance door and office window. To date, no suspects have been identified.

We entered into a monthly contract with AED123 on 04/02/2024 to help make sure the AED is up to code and operational.

A leak was discovered in one of our fire sprinkler lines, caused by moisture accumulation and subsequent rusting, which led to a crack. The affected pipe was replaced, and the system was reactivated without any interruption in service.



We would like to extend our special thanks to our Property Team for their ongoing support with routine maintenance activities, including replacing HVAC filters, light bulbs, trimming trees, moving mulch, and assisting with general clean-up tasks.

#### **Worship Report**

#### Mission Statement

"Create a sacred space of extravagant hospitality to encounter God, be joined in unity, and empowered to live as disciples of Jesus Christ."

#### What is Worship

I continue to ask myself this question; What is worship? How do I, how do you define 'Worship'? While reading an article asking that same question, a quote from the book, 'Engaging with God: a Biblical Theology of Worship' by David Peterson resonated with me. Peterson states, "Is worship, then, an ... experience or feeling? Is it to be identified with a special sense of the presence of God, or with some kind of religious ecstasy or with expressions of deep humiliation before God? Are there special moments in a Christian meeting when we are truly "worshipping" God? Are church services to be measured by the extent to which they enable the participants to enter into such experiences? Such a subjective approach is often reflected in the comments people make about Chrisitan gatherings, but it has little to do with biblical teaching on the matter."

The Lexham Theological Workbook goes on to state, "Worship is the awed response to the saving acts and praiseworthy character of God." The Eastons' Bible Dictionary adds, "... homage rendered to God which is sinful (idolatry) to render to any created being (Exod 34:14, Isa 2:8). Such worship was refused by Peter (Acts 10:25, 26) and by an angel (Rev 22:8, 9)".

Worship isn't about you or me. God invites us to join Him in what He is already doing. Whether we realize it or not, we never stop worshipping. At any given moment we are directing our affections, attention, and allegiance either to the one true God or to idols that cannot satisfy, comfort or rescue us. There's no way around it; we always live in the presence of God, coram deo.

#### A look back and a look forward

The Worship Team's checklist of recommendations and accomplishments may not be that long, but each one focuses on providing an all-inclusive worship experience for the live and digital worship community.

- · Narrative Lectionary: Beginning in September, we transitioned from the Revised Common Lectionary to the Narrative Lectionary which more closely follows the Bible from Genesis through Revelation
- · Updating and revision of Worship Team Methods and Procedures: We anticipate completion before the end of 1st Qtr. 2025.
- $\cdot$  Usher and Communication Assistant training: We have completed our first revised training session and added new members to both positions.



- · Welcome Center: This has become a focal point in the Narthex. Visitors and potential members receive a packet of information about Peace and programs available.
- · Name Tags: After a rocky start, the name tags have become a very popular feature. Name tags are provided to visitors as well as congregants.
- · Music Leader: We are happy to welcome Steven Robbins to become a part of the worship community assuming the role of Music Leader. Steven brings a fresh look and offers an abundance of musical knowledge and talent.
- · Children's Church God's Story: Designed for children K-5th grade, the children's service follows the theme of the regular service. Special thanks to Will Voges for making the Children's Cross
- · Improve on-line worship experience: We continue to explore add-on enhancements to the digital media. We especially welcome feedback (criticism and compliments) from the online worshippers.
- · Audio improvements: Installing additional equipment in the Sanctuary to enhance sound quality. Special thanks to John and Patti Kassel, and Martin and Carol Franz for the purchase of the Bose Controller. Coordinating with the Quilting Team to fabricate quilt-like acoustic curtains to hang in the Sanctuary and Narthex to reduce echo and improve the sound quality.
- · Aesthetics: (2024-2025): Outdoor improvements include the addition of large pots with trees to be installed on either side of the entrance. A New Creche has been installed near the entrance. Special thanks to Jim and Judy Johnson. We will be soliciting through eblast for donations to cover the cost of one planter and one plant. Indoor improvements will include new signage to reflect our mission, vision and values as well as directional signage to various areas

I want to thank the members of the team, Kathi Anderson, Michael Simpson, Sharon Anderson, and Pastor Jake. #### **Compassion Report**

2024 Annual Report

In 2023 a group of members were asked to serve on a newly created Compassion Team whose purpose it is to fulfill one of the 4 core values (compassion) that the Vision Committee established. We met monthly to discuss which members were in need of someone to talk with about facing life changes, struggles and stress. We each visit members who are living in nursing facilities to take communion to them and listen to their concerns. Mission Endowment Fund Committee Report for 1/26/2025 Annual Meeting

2024 saw the continued post pandemic revitalization of the Peace Lutheran Mission Endowment Fund Committee as several goals were accomplished. Many thanks to the other current members of the committee: Cheryl Braaten, Trice Kastein, Vicki Roda and Carola Davis (Council Representative). Pastor Jake Fain also serves as a non-voting advisory member of the committee.

First and foremost, the committee received 4 grant request applications in the fall of 2024 for 2025 fund disbursement. Grants are evaluated on their relevance to fulfilling the mission and vision of Peace Lutheran. Boosted by a very good year on returns from the fund's investment account and some individual donations, the fund balance allowed the committee to recommend approval to the Church Council of all 4 very deserving requests.
